## RN to M.S. – Bridge Program Major in Nursing

B.S. in Nursing for graduate students pursuing an M.S. degree. Graduate students applying to an M.S. degree program which requires a bachelor's degree in nursing, but who do not already hold a bachelor's degree in nursing, are required to complete additional undergraduate course prerequisites prior to beginning the M.S. program. Students in this program must complete the following courses as well as all M.S. degree requirements. The required undergraduate coursework can be completed in one academic year, after which time (unless still not qualified), the student can enter the graduate program. Upon successful completion of these undergraduate requirements and the M.S. program, the student will earn both a B.S. in Nursing and the M.S. degree. The B.S. degree in Nursing earned through the Bridge Program does not qualify for Degree Honors or Commencement Ceremony Honors. Neither degree will be awarded

without completion of all requirements for both degrees.
