## **Center for Access and Integration**

Students who complete the requirements of the BUILD program, including a selected career pathway in Arts and Communication, Business, or Human Services, earn a Certificate in Applied Studies. The program incorporates the skills and education necessary to live more independently, maintain meaningful employment, and value lifelong learning. Students in the BUILD program are integrated with the College of Arts, Sciences, and Education and contribute their own diverse experiences and strengths to the Bethel community.
